

Flamingo Flocking will occur twice a month, and continue through at least June 2024. 2 Flocks will be placed on Sunday evening and picked up on Wednesday evening. To have someone flocked, the donation is \$45. There is no fee for flocking-pick-up. However, for an other-than-Wednesday-evening removal, the donation is \$15, to be paid, of course, by the flockee. 2 Specialty Flocking: The flockor selects the non-Sunday flocking date and how long the flock remains standing at the flockee's home, along with any sign they would like the youth to create. The donation for a specialty flocking is \$100. 2 Antiflocking insurance may be obtained by anyone who does not want their yard flocked for a \$45 donation. The insurance will be good through June 2024.
