

From the Pastor:

Dear Church,

As we find ourselves settling into the rhythm of a new school year, there's a palpable shift in the air. The lazy, languid days of summer are behind us, replaced by the structure and routine of school schedules, extracurricular activities, and the daily grind. But before we know it, the whirlwind of the holiday season will be upon us—Halloween, Thanksgiving, and Christmas—bringing with it a flurry of events, responsibilities, and celebrations. As we prepare for the upcoming months, let's make a conscious effort not to become complacent in our faith. Let's use this time to cultivate a deeper relationship with God, finding joy in the everyday moments. Whether it's during a quiet morning prayer, a family meal, or

even in the hustle and bustle of school dropoffs and pickups, God is with us, inviting us to experience His peace and joy.

So, as we get into the groove of the school year and anticipate the holiday season, let's also recommit ourselves to our faith. Let's rejoice in the Lord always, embracing the routine and the special moments alike with a heart full of gratitude and a spirit of joy. In doing so, we'll find that our faith becomes not just a part of our lives, but the very rhythm that guides us through every season.

CUBA DONATION DRIVE – NOW UNTIL OCTOBER 13.

As many of you know we have two people traveling to Cuba in October. Kathy Kaiser and Joan Priest will be leaving October 20th to visit our two sister churches. You know the drill, since we had two visitors go to Cuba back in March of this year.

This provides us the opportunity to send much needed supplies to be used by the congregations there. They have pharmacies in Cuba, but as we have shared with you in the past, the shelves in the Cuban pharmacies are empty most of the time. The shortages are so severe that when the Cuban people go to the hospital, they are required to take their supplies with them.

Our first priority will be Over-the-Counter medicines. As you can see on the list that follows, in addition to OTC meds, we would like to send vitamins and supplements, medical devices, hygiene items, and reading glasses.

A bin will be located in the back of the church and if you would prefer that we do the shopping for you, there will also be money donation box.

Deadline for donations will be Sunday, October

13.

If you bring in any item with an expiration date, please check the date. It must be at least 12 months out, which means October 2025 or later.

The need is great and we are very grateful that with the help of our travelers we can avoid the obstacles and excessive cost of shipping these supplies. Thank you so much! -TEAM CUBA






