

From the Pastor:

Church,

As we approach the Thanksgiving season, many of us start dreaming about the perfect turkey, mashed potatoes, and, of course, pie—lots of pie! But beyond the food coma and family gatherings, Thanksgiving is a time to reflect on gratitude, service, and where we place our trust. Before we dive into those sweet potato casseroles (yuk), let's talk about something even more filling—community and faith.

Join us on Thursday, November 28th for our annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner. This event has become one of our church's most beloved traditions, and it's more than just a meal. It's an opportunity to share God's love with those around us—whether they are church regulars or someone walking in for the first time. We will be serving, laughing, and showing what true thanksgiving looks like—sharing from the heart.

Thanksgiving is biblical! As Paul writes in 1
Thessalonians 5:18, "Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Now, this doesn't mean we have to love every circumstance, but it does mean that there's always room for gratitude, even in the messiness of life. We're reminded that giving thanks isn't just for when things are easy—it's an act of faith in God's goodness no matter what's on our plates (whether literal or metaphorical).

In Psalm 107:1, we are called to "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever." It's a beautiful reminder that, as we look at the blessings and challenges of our lives, God's steadfast love is what truly sustains us. With a heated presidential election season looming, it can feel like Thanksgiving tables will need peacekeepers as much as turkey and stuffing. But let's remember, as followers of Christ, our ultimate loyalty isn't to a political party, but to the One who reigns over all creation.

Colossians 3:15 gives us this timely reminder: "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts since as members of one body you were called to peace. And be thankful." Amid the noise and debate, we're called to let Christ's peace guide us. After all, He's the true King, and no matter who's in the White House, we know Who's on the throne.

In this season, we are especially thankful for you, our church family. Whether you're bringing a pie, lending a hand at the dinner, or just showing up with a smile, your presence matters. Together, we're not just celebrating a holiday; we're living out the call to love and serve one another.

So, as you prepare your grocery lists and try to figure out where that one casserole dish went, don't forget to pause. Take a moment to thank God for the big and small things, and for the people in your life—even the ones who bring up politics at the dinner table (we're all thinking it!).








GIVING is another opportunity to go above and beyond

your normal giving to support the church. This collection always goes to our reserve fund, so that we may pay our bills when gifts and tithes will not cover our regular monthly expenses.


