Dear Church Family,

As the aroma of turkey and pumpkin pie fades from our homes (and possibly still lingers in some fridges), we pause to give heartfelt thanks for the overwhelming joy of our Community Thanksgiving Dinner! What a blessing it was to gather with neighbors, friends, and even a few strangers who quickly became family as we shared food, fellowship, and the love of Christ.

This year, we served hundreds of meals—each bite seasoned not only with spices but also with generosity and grace. Hurricane Ian Update December 2024

Yes! It's been over 26 months, and 2 hurricane seasons that we've been working through the very lengthy reimbursement processes with our insurance company and FEMA. Discussions continue with both parties to finalize accurate reimbursement. FEMA's process splits the eligible buildings into two projects. The portables are one project, and the Sanctuary/Education/Kitchen building is the other. Since the Portables Project has been finalized by FEMA and insurance, they will be repaired prior to our Sanctuary building. Let's review where we are at present:

Repairs completed:

- All 7 buildings on our campus have been reroofed.
- All 3 portables have been upgraded with spray foam insulation under roofs
- Gutters/downspouts/fascia/soffits have been repaired/replaced on sanctuary/education building.
- New air handler/compressor installed in the Administrative area
- New video camera and accessories installed to provide better live-streaming of services
- New lighting will be installed in the sanctuary before the end of December.

Repairs underway:

- New A/C units for all 3 portables
- Mold remediation from 1st floor of the Oaks Cove building
- Considering newer waterproofing methods of replacing walls on 1st floor of Oaks Cove
- Getting General Contractor bids for finishing the work on all 3 portables. (continued)

Work yet to be done:

Finish all walls/ceilings/floors/doors/windows in the main sanctuary building


Thanks to your donations for hurricane repairs along with a grant and monies received, thus far from FEMA and our Insurance, we can complete "Repairs Underway" section above. The anticipated FEMA assistance and remaining insurance reimbursement will hopefully cover a good amount of work yet to be done.

Youth Fundraiser Flamingo Flocking

The Youth and Jackie Guerin, our Youth Director, are bringing back this youth fundraiser. The "rules" are as follows:

- ► Flamingo Flocking will occur twice a month, and continue through at least June 2025.
- ► Flocks will be placed on Sunday evening and picked up on Wednesday evening. The flamingos will be in the flockee's yard for 3 days.
- ► To have someone flocked, the donation is \$45.
- ► There is no fee for flocking-pick-up. However, for an other-than-Wednesdayevening removal, the donation is \$15, to be paid, of course, by the flockee.
- ► Specialty Flocking: The flockor selects the non-Sunday flocking date and how long the flock remains standing at the flockee's home, along with any sign they would like the youth to create. The donation for a specialty flocking is \$100.
- ► Anti-flocking insurance may be obtained by anyone who does not want their yard flocked for a \$45 donation. The insurance will be good through June 2025.


