\$43,600. Unfortunately, during January, spendable donations were only \$41,329. However, those spendable donations were \$17 more than our expenditures! So far during February, spendable income is \$27,300 with only one week left. Although it appears we will be considerably short this month, the end-of-January checking account balance was over \$27,000, so we will probably cover the excess expenses without pulling on the Reserve Fund.


