

## From the Pastor:

Dear Church Family,

June opens with the echo of Pentecost, one of the most powerful and transformative moments in the life of the early Church. In Acts 2, we read how tongues of fire rested on each of the disciples, and they began to speak in other languages as the Spirit enabled them. But the real miracle wasn't just linguistic—it was relational.

Pentecost wasn't about everyone suddenly becoming multilingual. It was about the Spirit breaking down barriers. People from all nations, cultures, and walks of life heard the Good News in a way they could understand—not just with their ears, but with their hearts.

In a world still fractured by misunderstanding and division, Pentecost reminds us that through the Holy Spirit, we are able to connect across boundaries—whether those are cultural, generational, political, or personal. The Spirit gives us more than words; it gives us empathy, compassion, courage, and truth. The Spirit doesn't just help us talk—it helps us truly communicate.

And we need that Spirit in our community more than ever.

As disciples in this season, Pentecost challenges us to be translators of grace—in our workplaces, in our neighborhoods, and even in our families. That includes the dads, grandpas, mentors, and

spiritual fathers we'll celebrate this Father's Day. Whether biological or chosen, the influence of good men of faith—men who listen well, love deeply, and lead with humility—is a gift of the Spirit in action.

It also means trusting that even when our efforts feel small—like a prayer shared, a kind word spoken, a moment of patience or service—the Holy Spirit is moving through us in ways we may not see at first. We may not have tongues of fire resting on our heads today, but we still carry the flame.

That's why, when we open our campus to Vacation Bible School this month, we're not just offering songs and snacks—we're creating space for that flame to flicker into a child's life. It's why we hold worship, Bible study, community meals, and disaster response—not just to keep busy, but to stay Spirit-led and mission-focused.

So take heart, Gulf Cove UMC. The wind of Pentecost still blows. The fire still burns. And the Spirit still speaks through us—sometimes in words, but more often in actions that connect across the deepest languages of the human heart.

"And it shall come to pass that I will pour out my Spirit on all people..." —Joel 2:28
