May 20, 2025 Session 3 Scripture/Questions (3-5 group only) Mark 5:25-34 Unnamed Woman Healed of a Hemorrhage



25 Now there was a woman who had been suffering from a flow of blood for twelve years. 26 She had endured much under many physicians and had spent all that she had, and she was no better but rather grew worse. 27 She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, 28 for she said, "If I but

touch his cloak, I will be made well." 29 Immediately her flow of blood stopped, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. 30 Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched my cloak?" 31 And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, 'Who touched me?' "32 He looked all around to see who had done it. 33 But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. 34 He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

Session 3 / NT Questions (Mark 5:25-34 -Woman Healed by Jesus)

1.	Jesus was on his way to the home of Jairus when the woman finds her way through the crowd to him. She takes the initiative to go to him because she has heard he is a great healer. Before they even speak, she takes the initiative to touch the hem of his garment. She is the only woman in the scriptures to do so. Why are these bold actions for her, a woman, to take in that time and place?
2.	Why do you think she is not named?
3.	Why do you think Jesus insisted on finding the person who touched his clothes?
4.	The woman takes responsibility for her life and initiative for her own healing. What can you learn from her in your own life?
