Weekly Themes: God's Call and Human Choice

- Women Who Lead and Sing
 - Women who Ask Boldly
- Women in Times of Suffering
- Women Who speak with Wisdom

Format: 90 – minute sessions include opening prayer. Scripture reading, historical context, group discussion, journaling and creative activities, and closing prayers.

This is a time for study, fellowship, and encouragement as we learn from faithful, flawed, and chosen women of the Bible.

Week 1 - God's Call and Human Choice

• **OT Woman:** Rebekah (Genesis 24; 27)

• NT Woman: Herodias (Mark 6:14–29)

• **Focus:** Women's choices carry great weight — for blessing or for harm.

Background:

- Rebekah showed decisive action in securing God's promises but later used manipulation in Jacob/Esau's story.
- Herodias used influence to seek vengeance, leading to John the Baptist's death.

- o How do these women use their influence differently?
- When have you felt tempted to take matters into your own hands?
- Activities: Provided at Study

Week 2 - Women Who Lead and Sing

- **OT Woman:** Miriam (Exodus 15; Numbers 12)
- **NT Woman:** The Mother of James and John (Matthew 20:20–28)
- Focus: Women who desire leadership must balance ambition with humility.


Background:

- Miriam was both prophetess and critic; she led worship but also challenged Moses.
- Salome (Mother of James and John) asked Jesus for her sons' greatness, but Jesus redefined leadership.

- o How do ambition and leadership look different in God's kingdom?
- Can you name a time ambition clouded your faith, or a time it fueled good?
- Activities: Provided at Study

Week 3 - Women Who Ask Boldly

- **OT Woman:** Achsah (Joshua 15:16–19; Judges 1:12–15)
- **NT Woman:** The Canaanite Woman (Matthew 15:21–28)
- **Focus:** Bold requests, rooted in trust, move the heart of God.

Background:

- Achsah asked her father, Caleb, for land and springs claiming provision boldly.
- The Canaanite Woman boldly pleaded with Jesus, and her faith won healing for her daughter.

- o What do these women teach us about persistence in asking?
- o How does bold prayer show faith rather than presumption?
- Activities: Provided at Study

Week 4 - Women in Times of Suffering

- **OT Woman:** Jephthah's Daughter (Judges 11:29–40)
- **NT Woman:** Widow of Nain (Luke 7:11–17)
- **Focus:** Women suffer deeply in systems they do not control, but God sees their pain.

Background:

- Jephthah's Daughter suffers from her father's rash vow, a victim of patriarchal culture.
- o The Widow of Nain suffers profound loss, but Jesus restores her son.

- Where do you see women today bearing suffering not of their own making?
- o How can the community of faith respond with compassion and action?
- Activities: Provided at Study

Week 5 - Women Who Speak with Wisdom

- **OT Woman:** Huldah the Prophetess (2 Kings 22:11–20)
- **NT Women:** Mary and Martha (Luke 10:38–42; John 11:17–27)
- Focus: Women's voices of wisdom guide communities back to God.

Background:

- o Huldah boldly declared God's truth, confirming Josiah's reforms.
- Mary sat at Jesus' feet learning; Martha confessed Jesus as Messiah. Both gave voice to wisdom.

- What do these stories reveal about women's spiritual authority?
- o How do you cultivate wisdom in your own discipleship?
- Activities: Provided at Study
